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Frequently Asked Questions

What are implants?

They are small titanium screws that are placed in pre-drilled openings in the jaw bone to replace the root portion of a missing tooth. They are intended to fuse together with the jaw bone and provide a stable base for tooth restorations to be attached, including dental crowns, dentures and dental bridges, giving you the look and functionality of a real tooth.

They are made from titanium to prevent irritation and allergies.

Advantages of implants

Implants are an effective solution for people who have missing teeth as it can restore a single tooth, a number of teeth or an entire arch of teeth. Implants are long lasting and provide excellent levels of smile aesthetics and functionality. They allow you to speak clearly and eat what you like, providing a natural, healthy and attractive smile. Implants also work to lessen bone loss and, when used with dentures, increase bite power and ensure denture stability.

Am I a suitable candidate?

Most people who have missing teeth are suitable candidates for dental implants. In some instances, if there is a lack of dense bone tissue to sustain the implant, we may need to carry out a bone grafting procedure. Dental implants may not be suitable for people who smoke as this slows the body's natural healing process and increases the risk of implant failure. During a consultation we will discuss all your needs and concerns about implants and your suitability.

How many appointments are necessary?

First you will have a consultation appointment when the reason for the implant and your goals will be discussed, along with the different options available to reach your goal. The treatment option you decide on will dictate the number of appointments necessary, but assume at least two to three further appointments with

gaps of several weeks in between the first and second surgical appointment followed by a final follow-up appointment. Full details will be laid out in your treatment plan.

How long will the implant last?

Dental implants are designed to be a permanent, long-lasting solution to tooth loss. However, their lifespan depends entirely on how well you look after your teeth and your oral hygiene.

Although this procedure takes a long time from start to finish, dental implants have a very high success rate and can save the integrity of your mouth for lifelong health

How long is the recovery time?

Recovery time is dependent on how many implants you have fitted and the level of your overall health, but most patients will recover 10-days post procedure. It is imperative that you follow the advice given to you, remain smoke-free and maintain good dental hygiene in accordance with your recovery plan.

Does implant treatment hurt?

Many people worry about dental pain and just visiting the dentist generally can feel like a stressful experience. Many people are unsure about having implants because they are worried about it being a painful experience. However, dental implant procedures are usually pain free although the procedure may be a little uncomfortable for some. The benefit of the implants does mean however that they could prevent further issues and discomfort later on.
